TRANSCRIPT 1

This month the 23rd edition of the Winter Olympics will be **taking place** in Pyeongchang, South Korea from February 8 – 25. The county of Pyeongchang is located in the northeastern part of South Korea and, according to the official website of the Games, has a population of about 43,000 people. Two other locations, Gangneung and Jeongseon, will also be hosting events.

Pyeongchang beat out Munich, Germany and Annecy, France to win the 2018 Games. Pyeongchang had previously lost to Vancouver and Sochi for the 2010 and 2014 Winter Games, respectively.

In 1988 South Korea hosted the Summer Olympics. One event that received a lot of **publicity** that year was the 100-meter race that featured an intense rivalry between America's Carl Lewis and Canada's Ben Johnson. Johnson won the race but was later disqualified.

The last Winter Olympics were held in Sochi, Russia and the top 3 countries in the final medal count – based on the total number of medals won – were Russia, the United States, and Norway. Japan and South Korea both **took home** a total of 8 medals each.

TRANSCRIPT 2

There will be a total of 15 different sports at the Pyeongchang Olympics including figure skating, curling, speed skating, ski jumping, and ice hockey. Ice hockey fans will not be able to see their favorite National Hockey League (NHL) players at these Games. NHL players have taken part in the last five Winter Olympics going all the way back to Nagano in 1998. The Canadian men's and women's ice hockey teams are the defending champions.

Although not competing at these Olympics, Kim Yuna, the gold medalist at the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics, is one of the honorary ambassadors. Many Japanese fans of figure skating will **recall** that Mao Asada finished second to Kim Yuna eight years ago in Vancouver.

The Paralympic Games will start on March 9 and run until March 18, and will feature wheelchair curling, alpine and cross-country skiing, ice hockey (also known as sledge hockey), biathlon and snowboarding.

Mascots are always a fun part of the Olympics. For the Pyeongchang Games, a white tiger named Soohorang was chosen, while Bandabi, an Asian black bear, will represent the Paralympic Games.

Finally, the next Winter Olympics will be held in Beijing, and of course Tokyo will be hosting the next Summer Games in 2020, making it 3 Olympics **in a row** in Asia.
