



TRANSCRIPT 1

In February, many music fans will be *tuning in to* the Grammy Awards to see how their favorite artists do. 'The Grammys' are an annual awards ceremony for the music industry and the 2019 show will be the 61st edition. According to the New Oxford American Dictionary, the word 'Grammy' is a mixture of 'gramophone' and 'Emmy', the latter being the name of the award presented at 'The Emmys', a TV awards event.

Some famous victories over the last few decades in the 'Record of the Year' category include: 'Hello' (Adele, 2017), 'Change the World' (Eric Clapton, 1997) 'Beat It' (Michael Jackson, 1984) and 'Hotel California' (Eagles, 1978).

In 2018, Bruno Mars won several awards including 'Record of the Year' and 'Song of the Year.' Some famous artists with twenty or more Grammy wins over the course of their career include Stevie Wonder, Beyonce, and Bruce Springsteen. Wonder and Mars, *along with* many other famous singers, have appeared in a TV segment called 'Carpool Karaoke' with James Corden. Corden, a TV talk show host, first hosted the Grammys in 2017.

The first Grammy Awards were actually held in two different locations at the same time, Los Angeles and New York. The 2018 event was held in Madison Square Garden, home of the NBA's New York Knicks, while in 2019 it will be in the Staples Center – home arena of the LA Lakers and Clippers.

TRANSCRIPT 2

Another major annual awards ceremony taking place in February is 'The Academy Awards', or 'The Oscars' as they are also known. This ceremony *rewards* excellence in the film industry.

The very first Academy Awards ceremony was held in 1929 and the 2019 edition is the 91st. A few of the interesting TV milestones listed on their website include 1953, the first time the Oscars were broadcast on television, 1966, when audiences could first watch them in color, and 1969, when proceedings were first televised around the world. In 2018, roughly 26 million people watched the Academy Awards.

In 2018, 'The Shape of Water' won the 'Best Picture' award, while the Oscars for 'Best Actor' and 'Best Actress' went to Gary Oldman and Frances McDormand respectively. When it comes to Japanese productions, two films won an Oscar in 2009, one for 'Best Foreign Language Film,' and the other for 'Best Animated Film'. The famous golden statuette that the winners take home weighs about 4 kg and is just over 34 cm tall.

The show's host plays a *pivotal* role and some of the most famous include comedians Bob Hope, Billy Crystal and Ellen DeGeneres, as well as actors Hugh Jackman and Neil Patrick Harris. *Chronologically*, the Oscars come before the Cannes Film Festival which is held in May. Other important film festivals include those in Toronto and Venice.
