TRANSCRIPT 1

In June 2018, Russia will be hosting their first FIFA World Cup. The tournament will run from June 14th to July 15th and the matches will take place in 11 different cities.

A total of 32 teams will be hoping to win soccer, or football's, biggest prize. Germany are the **defending** champions after winning their fourth title in Brazil in 2014 when they **defeated** Argentina 1 to 0. Former champions from 2010 Spain will be in the same group as Portugal, the Euro 2016 champions. England, winners of the 1966 World Cup, will be in the same group as newcomers Panama, while Iceland, also celebrating their first ever World Cup appearance, will be in Argentina's group, a two-time winner. Japan, co-host of the 2002 World Cup, will **square off** against Columbia, Poland and Senegal. One high-profile team that did not qualify is Italy, a 4-time champion. Brazil lead all nations with 5 titles, their most recent one coming in 2002.

The Russian World Cup is the 21st edition. The first one was held in 1930 and was won by the host nation, Uruguay, when they **defeated** Argentina by a score of 4 to 2. Uruguay won their second title 20 years later.

The draws for this tournament's groups took place on December 1st, 2017, a few days before the IOC announced that Russia would be **banned** from the 2018 Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang.

TRANSCRIPT 2

The attention of the soccer world will shift to women in 2019 when the 8th edition of the Women's World Cup will be played in France. The first Women's World Cup took place in China in 1991. Sweden (1995), the U.S. (1999 & 2003), Germany (2011) and Canada (2015) have also hosted the event. The United States have won 3 titles, one more than Germany and two more than Norway and Japan. In total 24 teams will be participating.

Returning to the men's game, adidas and Nike will renew their World Cup rivalry. Some teams that will be wearing the German company's jerseys are Germany, Argentina, Spain and Japan. Four big names that the Oregon-based company will be supplying are Brazil, France, Portugal and England. The official ball for the tournament is adidas' Telstar 18 and the mascot is a wolf called "Zabivaka," which FIFA explained means "the one who scores" in Russian.

The next Men's World Cup will be held in Qatar. Rather than being held in the heat of summer, it will start in November, making the gap between tournaments a little longer and giving the Russian World Cup champions a few more months to **savor** their victory.
