TRANSCRIPT 1

As the name itself **suggests**, the G7, or Group of Seven, is made up of 7 member countries – Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The group meets annually to discuss international issues such as the economy, security and environment.

At the 2018 G7 summit held in Canada, some of the key topics included jobs of the future, the climate and clean energy, and women's **empowerment**. It was the sixth such gathering Canada has hosted. The host leader was Justin Trudeau, the son of former Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, host of the 1981 G7 summit. The G7 presidency changes every year and in 2019 it is France's turn to host the conference in Biarritz in late August.

The G7's origins go back to 1975 when 6 of the current member countries first **got together** in France. Japan's Prime Minister at the time was Takeo Miki. Canada was not part of the original group but did become a member in 1976. The last time Japan hosted a G7 summit was in 2016 when it was held in Ise-Shima in Mie Prefecture. Japan has also been **designated** host of the G20 summit in Osaka in June 2019, aiming to promote the city as it readies itself for holding Expo 2025 in the same location.

TRANSCRIPT 2

As seven of the world's biggest economies, the member countries make some of the most famous products in the world. For example, six of the seven produce cars including Renault, Mercedes, Ferrari, Toyota, Rolls-Royce, and Ford, to name just a few.

Here are a few facts and figures about the member countries based on recent Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (or OECD) data.

In terms of population, in 2013 Canada had the fewest people – roughly 35 million – while the U.S. had the most – about 317 million.

In politics in 2017, Japan had the lowest number of female **ministers** – almost 16% - while France had the highest – just under 53%. When it comes to the gender wage gap, data for 2014 show Italy had the smallest difference – about 6% - while Japan had the largest – approximately 26%. The US, Germany, and the UK were all around 17%.

As for the average life expectancy of men and women at birth, the top 3 countries in 2015 were Japan, Italy, and France at about 84, 83, and 82 years respectively. The US **came in** in seventh position at around 79 years.
