TRANSCRIPT 1

One of the most **prestigious** car manufacturers in the world is the German car company BMW. BMW's history goes all the way back to 1916 which means in 2016 it celebrated a **significant** milestone, its 100th anniversary.

BMW is well-known for both their cars and their motorcycles, and according to their website, they actually produced a motorbike before a car with their first one coming out in 1923. Five years later BMW became a car manufacturer and in 1932 they started designing their own cars.

When it comes to production plants for their cars, the company opened a US facility in 1994 in South Carolina. That same year they acquired the *Mini* brand and in 2003 BMW took full control of one of the most famous automotive brands in the world, Rolls-Royce. According to BMW, they had 30 production locations around the world in 2018.

In 2017, the BMW group sold over 2 million BMW cars, about 370,000 Minis, close to 3,400 Rolls-Royces, and made approximately 186,000 motorcycles.

TRANSCRIPT 2

The BMW name has also been **associated** with Formula One. One team they partnered with was Brabham which ran BMW engines for several seasons in the 1980s. During this period the Brazilian driver Nelson Piquet won the Drivers' Championship in 1983, **narrowly** beating out France's Alain Prost. Brabham BMW finished third that year in the Constructors' Championship, 17 points behind winners Ferrari.

In 2000 BMW engines powered Williams, one of Formula One's most successful teams. That year Ralf Schumacher, Michael Schumacher's younger brother, and Jenson Button drove for the team. Williams BMW ended the season third in the team standings behind Ferrari and McLaren Mercedes. The partnership ended after the 2005 season.

From 2006 to 2009 they participated in F1 as Sauber BMW. During this time they finished the season in the top three spots in the team championship twice. In 2007 they were classified in second and in 2008 they **came in** third. That same year, Robert Kubica won the Grand Prix in Montreal. In their final season, Sauber BMW finished in sixth position.
