TRANSCRIPT 1

The Tribeca Film Festival (TFF) has been held in New York City every year since 2002. It was founded by actor Robert De Niro, film producer Jane Rosenthal and real estate investor Craig Hatkoff in response to the September 11 terrorist attacks. They wanted to help **revitalize** the economy and culture in the Lower Manhattan section of New York City.

The first festival, held in April 2002, featured more than 150 films including short films, documentaries, and feature films. Some of the highlights included the premiere of Star Wars Episode II: Attack of the Clones and a collection of films about New York that was **curated** by director Martin Scorsese.

Although De Niro's name helped attract a lot of attention to the TFF, some local filmmakers **criticized** the festival for being more about big Hollywood productions like Star Wars instead of films made in the community.

TRANSCRIPT 2

Each year, the Tribeca Film Festival receives over 6,000 submissions from around the world. The festival draws an **estimated** three million people—including celebrities from the worlds of art, film, and music—and generates \$600 million annually.

The 2018 TFF was held from April 18th to 29th at 10 venues around the Tribeca area. Tickets for the films were affordable with weekday matinees as low as \$12. The evening and weekend screenings were \$23, and the Tribeca Talks were \$40. After many of the screenings, the director and members of the cast and crew were available to answer questions.

'Tribeca Talks' are conversations or panel discussions with **prominent** people from the world of film and media. Some of the talks take place after screenings of particular movies.

The closing event of the 2018 TFF was a world premiere screening of filmmaker Liz Garbus's *The Fourth Estate*, which is a documentary about The New York Times during the Trump administration. After the showing there was a panel discussion featuring the director, as well as executive editor and prominent journalists of The New York Times.
