



TRANSCRIPT 1

William Boeing, the founder of the Boeing Company, made a **fortune** in the timber industry in Washington state before he dreamed of designing and building airplanes. He founded the Pacific Aero Products Company in Seattle in 1916 and changed the name to the Boeing Company the next year.

Boeing's first production order came from the United States Navy after the country entered World War I in 1917. The Navy ordered 50 Model C airplanes which were used to train pilots. Over the next ten years, the company stayed in business thanks to government contracts with the military and the postal service.

In 1933, Boeing released the Model 247 which was the first modern passenger airliner. Boeing **exclusively** sold the planes to its **subsidiary** United Airlines. The government considered that practice monopolistic, so the company was forced to split into 3 smaller companies: Boeing Airplane Company, United Airlines, and United Aircraft Corporation.

TRANSCRIPT 2

Boeing is currently the largest aerospace company in the world, and it is based in Chicago. Its customers include airlines and the governments of 150 countries.

Boeing is **organized** into 2 major business units: Boeing Commercial Airplanes and Boeing Defense, Space & Security. The company has 140,800 employees spread across 70 countries and of those employees, the majority of them have college degrees.

One of Boeing's largest customers is the US government. In 2016, the company received about \$26.5 billion worth of contracts from the US government. The airplane that transports the American president is **designated** Air Force One and Boeing has supplied those aircrafts for over 50 years.

Boeing **suffered** a major setback in 2019 when aviation regulators and airlines began grounding their new 737 Max series due to two fatal crashes, Lion Airline Flight 610 and Ethiopian Airlines Flight 302. The long-term impact of these groundings remains to be seen.
