TRANSCRIPT 1

The Fuji Rock Festival is one of the largest outdoor music festivals in Japan and has been held annually at Naeba Ski Resort in Niigata, Japan since 1999. The festival takes its name from the original location of the event in 1997, which was at the base of Mt. Fuji. Fuji Rock is one of the most famous music festivals in Japan, **attracting** some of the most well-known international artists each year.

In the first year that Fuji Rock was held, it was hit by a large typhoon that resulted in the cancelation of the second day of the festival. This was particularly **ironic** given that the theme of its first year was "a symbiosis of music and nature." Despite these difficulties with nature, the first year did feature a now legendary set by the punk-rock band The Red Hot Chili Peppers. The band played through the storm despite one of its members having a broken arm.

Fuji Rock is usually held over 3 days in the last weekend of July, with many ticketholders deciding to camp out in the area to take advantage of the mild weather and stunning natural views.

TRANSCRIPT 2

One aspect that sets Fuji Rock apart from some of its rivals such as Summer Sonic is its emphasis on international talent and **eclectic** music styles. Besides featuring major acts from the U.S., U.K. and Japan, festival management has also made an effort to include music styles and groups from parts of the world that tend to get less time in the **spotlight**.

Some acts that fall under this category and have appeared at Fuji Rock in the past include Ethiopian jazz musician Mulatu Astatke and the Afro-Caribbean styles of Los Gaunches. In addition to the emphasis on rock and electronic music, the festival has also **carved out** space for other music forms such as jazz.

Another interesting **anecdote** related to Fuji Rock is that it is known as the cleanest large-scale music festival in the world. Much of the waste produced at the festival is immediately recycled back into energy as biodiesel to power three of the event stages. The festival also makes use of solar power to help power other stages as well.
