TRANSCRIPT 1

The Masters Tournament, held in Augusta, Georgia every year, is one of four major golf tournaments which also include the US Open, the PGA Championship, and the Open Championship. As it is an invitational event, participants become **eligible** based on certain **criteria**. The current top 50 golfers in the world rankings are invited, as are past major golf tournament winners, and amateur golf champions from around the world.

Created by Bobby Jones, The Masters was first played in 1934 where the official prize money was \$1,500. Today prize money has grown considerably, with the winner receiving \$2,070,000 in 2021. Of the winners in Masters' history, Jack Nicklaus has won it six times with Tiger Woods on five and Arnold Palmer on four. In 2021 Hideki Matsuyama became the first Japanese and Asian player to ever win the event.

Along with the fourth highest winner's purse, winning The Masters comes with the most **sought after** green jackets in world sport. Winners can keep the iconic jacket for one year, when it then has to be returned to the club and held in a specially designed cloakroom. There are strict rules stating that the jacket cannot be worn outside of the golf club's grounds.

TRANSCRIPT 2

Over the years, many interesting traditions have developed. On the Wednesday before each tournament, a 3-Par contest is held between the participants. This is held over 9 holes in a specially designed part of the course. The winner of the 3-Par tournament has never won the Masters. Another tradition is the honorary opening tee shot. This is usually done by legendary players that are not currently active. Jack Nicklaus has started the tournament since 2011.

The Augusta National Golf Club, which hosts The Masters, has seen a few **controversies** over the years. The first African American member, Ron Townsend, wasn't accepted into the club until 1990. In 2002 a public battle between Martha Burk and the club occurred over its male-only policy. This kept the club in the headlines until 2021, when finally the first women were admitted to the club.

In order to keep up with the advancement of golfers, the course is constantly changing. One of the most notable changes was in 2002 which was **dubbed** "Tiger Proofing". After Tiger Woods won the championship for a second straight year, more than half of the holes were lengthened, and more trees were added to make it more challenging for the players.
